July 19, 2009
Anderson, CA.**

Official Minutes:

Region Chair L. Joe Schwarm called the meeting to order at 9:40 a.m. Pledge was done by PDG Skip O'Brien, Song by ZC Sharon O'Brien, Invocation given by District Chaplain PDG Dave Marceau. IPDG Bob Garr gave the Welcome and made Introductions. Club Roll Call was taken with 30 clubs represented. Secretary's Report approved as printed in the Mane Lion.

Treasurer's Report: PDG Dave Marceau announced that CT Donna Kendall was called out of state.

Region Reports:

Shasta Region: RC Maggie Robeson introduced outgoing and incoming Zone Chairs present. 282 Lions at start of period, 299 at end. Attendance averaged 80%. 23 Fundraisers with 1,059 MH raised \$12,722.51. 76 Service projects with 2,101 MH resulted in \$19,110.10 spent. 6 clubs publishing bulletins, 2 clubs have web sites. One official visitation by the Burney Club. RC visited one club.

South Butte Region: RC Paul Halcomb praised his very active clubs and noted that nearly \$50,000 was raised in the last quarter. He introduced and praised his hard-working Zone Chairs. 199 members at start of period, 198 at end with loss of one. Average attendance was 45%. 38 Fundraisers with 1,888 MH and \$48,435 raised. 141 Service projects with 3,423 MH resulted in \$36,156 spent. 5 club visitations were made. Three clubs publish bulletins.

North Butte Region: RC Margaret Albiston introduced and thanked ZC Joe Miller and reported that all clubs are gaining membership. She noted that many clubs put flags out on the recent holidays. No written report.

Lassen Region: RC Joe Schwarm introduced Zone Chairs present. He told of the recent Peddler's Faire and the Century Bike Ride in his region. No written report.

Committee Reports:

Awards: L. Ray Marschner implores new Region Chairs to call now with questions, don't wait until the end of the year to ask about Awards points. He also asks clubs **NOT** to e-mail their club bulletins – he needs paper copies. Training for RC and ZC and Club Secretaries to be announced soon.

Budget & Finance: L. Don Ruble reported that Budget & Finance Committee held their 5th meeting at 8:30 a.m. on July 19. They reviewed recent corrections to the 2009-10 Budget after a \$450 error was discovered.

Convention Management: PDG Steve Robeson reported for PDG Bob Prahm who is recovering from surgery. PDG Bob's final Convention report was read. Next year's dates are April 16 – 18 and the theme is "Going Native International". Convention Management will meet with Gaia Hotel employee for a tour and a short meeting at 3 p.m.

Camp McCumber: PDG Bob Trueax reported on the success of the recent Camp for Children with Diabetes. Red Bluff Lions have adopted the Nurses' Cabin. Gridley Lions will be making update changes to old cabins.



City of Hope: L. Chris Bohn reports that May donations by clubs in our district totaled \$139.36. June donations were \$606.86. She plans to order locking donation boxes to set out at restaurants, etc. If clubs would like some, please call her. At the City of Hope facility there is a rotating electronic listing of donors, taking the place of the donor tiles. Clubs donating \$300 receive a certificate and pin, other items are sent for larger donations. Paradise Host recently donated \$500.

All Star Football: PDG Bob Trueax reported this year's game will be held at Shasta High on July 25. He distributed posters, asking clubs to put them up in their home towns.

Directory: PDG Bob Trueax passed them out this morning. As always, a Directory is free to all District and Club officers. Cost is \$5 for additional Directories.

Health Foundation: PDG Bob Trueax noted that the Diabetic Camp had extra staff this year. The actual cost is \$476 per camper – we charge \$300. Current total assets are \$24,527.44 which is just enough to run camp for one year. Family Camp for under-8 diabetic kids and their parents will be held August 14-16.

Humanitarian Foundation: PDG Bob Trueax announced that the committee will meet at 3 p.m. July 19 to discuss one request. Health Foundation will also meet this afternoon.

Youth Exchange: DG Becki announced the vacancy of the chairmanship of this important committee. Any interested volunteer is being sought.

Lions Eye Foundation: DG Becki attended the July 18 meeting and was elected a Trustee.

Lions in Sight: L. Don Ruble reported on the work day in Vallejo attended by Peach Bowl and Sutter Lions. Currently have 3,282 pr. Of glasses in storage – they will be taken to the warehouse this winter. L. Coy Moody collects for the North.

Mane Lion: Editor L. Patti Jenkins mailed 98 copies of the July edition, sent 432 by e-mail. She will publish the latest District Governor's Visitation Schedule in her next edition. Cut-off date by the 20th of the month. L. Patti asks anyone with an e-mail address to send it to her. If you change your address, **PLEASE** let her know. She will post any corrections in next edition—call or e-mail her.

Proud Lion: PDG Dorothy Buffington reported she has presented 10 Proud Lion/Sponsor pins in the last year.

Announcements:

DG Becki presented a Short Tail Award to L. Brock Bowen.

L. Jay Puls showed a board of Sight First pins and reported that \$11,724 was earned for Sight First II with the two pins he created and sold.

Forms passed out: Zone Chair monthly report, Club Activity Report, Governor's Visitation Schedule.

IMAGE AWARD**

Sutter Lions Club, nominated by Native Daughters of the Gooden West South Butte Parlor #226, captured the prestigious Image Award at the annual Grand Parlor of Native Daughters of the Golden West in San Jose this past June. The Image Award recognizes the efforts of individuals, groups, organizations or businesses that publicly portray the positive image of California. Lions Ron Whisenhunt and Lion Bruce Smith accepted the award in recognition of the Sutter Lions Club's efforts to serve the entire Sutter County community through its Avenue of Flags Project acquired large American Flags and poles for Sutter cemetery to display on special occasions to honor all who protect and serve the United States and the Golden State of California.

CITY OF HOPE

City of Hope and Lions have had a successful partnership for over 50 years. One area in particular has been an especially high priority for LCI and City of Hope is diabetes. As the number one cause of kidney failure and the leading cause of blindness among Americans between the ages of 25 and 74, diabetes is a debilitating and divesting disease. While City of Hope is best known for breakthroughs in cancer research and treatment, many of the most important discoveries in diabetes research have been made at City of Hope, including identifying human insulin, the development of Humulin (synthetic human insulin) and Islet Cell transplantation, a promising new experimental treatment for Type 1 diabetes.

I know that most of you are aware that you will no longer be acknowledged with a tile on the wall at City of Hope, and you are unable to get the tiles that you may already have there. They are unable to remove tiles without them breaking. Their new plan of recognition for Club and individual donations now is a certificate and various other gifts depending on the amount of the donation. Starting at \$300 you will receive a certificate and City of Hope Lions pin. You can make your donation in small increments, but it must be received during their fiscal year which goes from October 1sts to September 30th.

Donations are generally down from all sources, so I am suggesting that you could use one of the acrylic locking collection boxes that they have available. You can put it where the public will donate, such as at the cash register where your club meets. If you would like for me to order one for you please let me know with the following information that City of Hope is asking for: Club Name – Contact Person and Phone number – Name of restaurant/business where box will be placed – Address – Phone # of restaurant/business.

CAMP McCUMBER DIABETIC CAMP

Following is an email received by PDG Bob Trueax from very grateful parents of a newly diagnosed Type 1 diabetic. Last year 21 Lions clubs donated to the camp. With each club donating approximately \$300 they still fell short of the \$34,000 that it cost to run camp for one week. They had to draw from their savings to finish paying for camp. Some of the cost for camp is paying was 18 nurses, one doctor, 32 counselors and 3 staffers to be with the children.

I didn't want much time to go by with out sending you an email thanking you. My daughter Taylore attended the camp last week for the first time. She was just diagnosed with Type 1 Diabetes the last week of May. We found out about your camp and were a little unsure about sending her to camp this soon. However, she was up for it so her dad and I went ahead and signed her up. I think I was more nervous and anxious about it than she was.
